

BORNEO: SARAWAK – PRE-TOUR TO THE BORNEO (SABAH) TOUR

14 - 20 AUGUST 2020 14 - 20 AUGUST 2021

The Malaysian province of Sarawak in Borneo is rougher than Sabah, so we start with the more difficult part (as a pre-tour) and end with the part with comfortable accommodation (Sabah). We do recommend not missing Sarawak, though, as it provides superior chances of seeing **Bluebanded Pitta**, **Bornean Banded Pitta**, **Hose's Broadbill**, **Bulwer's Pheasant**, **Rail-babbler**, and other absolute jewels that will burn your eyes. And we also will be looking for species we have no chance of seeing on our Sabah tour – e.g. **Dulit Frogmouth**, **Bornean Frogmouth**, and **Black Oriole**.

This trip starts in Miri, Sarawak, and ends in Kota Kinabalu, Sabah.

This pre-tour to our <u>Birding Tour Borneo</u>: <u>Borneo Premium – Bristlehead</u>, <u>Pittas</u>, <u>Eight Hornbills</u>, <u>Endemics</u>, <u>Orangutans and More</u> can also be booked as a stand-alone tour. If combined with our main tour it could also be combined, after the main tour, with our <u>Birding Tour Malaysia</u>: <u>Peninsular Malaysia</u>.

Itinerary (7 days/6 nights)

Day 1. Arrival at Miri airport and transfer to your hotel

After a meet and greet at the Miri airport you will be transferred to your hotel for an overnight stay.

Overnight: transit hotel, Miri

Day 2. Miri to Ba'kelalan

We transfer to the Miri airport after breakfast and take a domestic flight to Ba'kelalan. Upon arrival we will check into Homestay Ba'kelalan. After lunch we proceed to a nearby forest for



some of Borneo's classic and famous endemics. These include the likes of Whitehead's Spiderhunter, Whitehead's Broadbill, Fruithunter, Mountain Serpent Eagle, Blackthroated Wren-Babbler, Bornean Stubtail, Bornean Spiderhunter, Bornean Barbet, Mountain Barbet, Golden-naped Barbet, Bare-headed Laughingthrush, Chestnut-hooded Laughingthrush, Bornean Whistler, and many others. We also hope to encounter Rufoustailed Jungle Flycatcher, Ferruginous Partridge, Orange-breasted Trogon, Dark Hawk Cuckoo, Common Green Magpie, etc. After dinner we will head to a nearby forest for Dulit Frogmouth.

Day 3. Ba'kelalan

A full day of birding this magnificent area.

Day 4. Ba'kelalan to Paya Maga Highlands

After breakfast we drive overland for three hours to the Paya Maga Highlands. These highlands are covered in secondary forest with an abundance of *Macaranga*. We'll bird the logging road from where the road begins, then go beyond Gunung Doa (at 850 meters/2500 feet) to the base of the Paya Maga Camp Site (1050 meters/3100 feet). The habitat along the road consists of mixed dipterocarp and lower montane forest. Occasional patches of undisturbed forest (montane heath forest) remain, particularly on the steepest slopes. Targets are **Bulwer's Pheasant**, **Black Oriole**, **Bornean Banded Pitta**, **Blue-banded Pitta**, **Hose's Broadbill**, and others. After dinner tonight we can try for **Bornean Frogmouth**.

Day 5. Paya Maga Highlands

After breakfast we continue birding this area, hoping to add species to our list that might include more endemics. Hopefully we'll find Bornean Leafbird, Bornean Bulbul, Pygmy White-eye, Bornean Banded Kingfisher, Bornean Treepie, Chestnut-crested Yuhina, and any of the goodies we missed the previous day. While not endemic, Rail-babbler is likely at the top of many people's wish-lists if they haven't seen it in southern Thailand or Peninsular Malaysia. We'll also be sure to search for Collared Owlet, Hill Blue Flycatcher, Jambu Fruit Dove, White-necked Babbler, Eyebrowed Wren-Babbler, Temminck's Babbler, the attractive Scaly-breasted Bulbul, Finsch's Bulbul, Olive-backed Woodpecker, Rufous-collared Kingfisher, Diard's Trogon, Red-bearded Bee-eater, etc.

Overnight: wooden house, Paya Maga Camp Site

Day 6. Paya Maga to Beaufort

After breakfast we continue birding until noon before trekking back to our vehicle and overlanding three to four hours by 4x4 to Beaufort.

Overnight: Beaufort

Day 7. Beaufort to Klias Wetland to Kota Kinabalu

In the morning we proceed to Klias Wetland for **Hook-billed Bulbul**, **Grey-breasted Babbler**, **Scarlet-breasted Flowerpecker**, **Red-crowned Barbet**, **Chestnut-bellied Malkoha**, etc. After eating lunch en route we drive to Kota Kinabalu, from where you can fly home or where you can rest (or process photos!) until lunch time the next day if you're joining our Sabah tour.



Please note that the itinerary cannot be guaranteed as it is only a rough guide and can be changed (usually slightly) due to factors such as availability of accommodation, updated information on the state of accommodation, roads, or birding sites, the discretion of the guides, and other factors.
